What is the Family Service Network?

A collaboration of 8 (funded) SF providers offering family-centered-care to over 400 HIV-positive WICY and affected family members through:

- > Comprehensive, coordinated medical/specialty care
- > Psychosocial services co-located at medical sites
- > Access to medical/clinical research trials

[WICY: Women 25 yrs/older; youth 13-24; infected children/infants, HIV-exposed infants]


Funded in 2001 by Ryan White CARE Act Title IV/Part D: Current allocation: \$495K (Aug. 1, 2015-July 31, 2016)

HIVE

(A Hub of Positive Reproductive & Sexual Health)

- Founded in 1989/formerly known as Bay Area Perinatal AIDS Clinic (BAPAC). Clinical care and intensive case management.
- Serves: HIV-pregnant women/HIV-negative pregnant women with HIV-partners. Not pediatrics/infants referred to FHIVC/clinic.

 Over 20 years providing pre-conception, prenatal, Gyn./sexual health care

 Collaborates with Ward 86 and FHC to provide postpartum care and services for affected family members

Family Health Center's HIV Clinic



- Under SFGH's Family Health Center (which serves 12,000 patients), FHIVC serves 1% of FHC patients
- Family-oriented integrated primary care for HIV+ patients and their families, including postpartum care. Also serves co-infected with HIV and Hep C
- Weekly clinic mtg. with Medical Providers, Pharmacist, and Case Manager

Larkin Street Youth Services

Serves: Assisted Care/Aftercare youth at on-site Clinic (129 Hyde Street) with clinical care, txment adherence, and mental health services

Collaborates: with Ward 86 Nurse Practitioner to transition youth to adult care





Consumer Advisory Board (CAB)

- Required by HRSA to ensure consumer voice/FSN meets HIV+ community needs
- 6-8 consumers meet monthly/involved with grant planning, evaluation, and CQI/give provider/unmet needs feedback
- 1 Rep sits on FSN Executive Committee/Meets monthly
- Empowerment and training, workshops, and health fairs
- Partnerships with HIVE and Maitri: co-meet and events
