Minutes

1. Call to Order and Roll Call. Introduction of Members of the Public.

The meeting was called to order at 3:34 pm by Co-Chair Shriver. Roll was called and quorum was established.

2. Review and Approve July 22nd 2019 DRAFT Agenda – VOTE

The July 22nd 2019 DRAFT Agenda was reviewed, amended and approved by consensus.

3. Review and Approve June 24th 2019 DRAFT Minutes - VOTE

The June 24th 2019 DRAFT Minutes were reviewed, and approved by consensus.

4. Announcements

• Thomas Knoble spoke to the change management agenda item from last meeting.

5. Public Comment

Bill Hirsh (ALRP) announced some successes during this Budget year: The city backfilled the RWCF cut,
 2% CODP increase for Ryan White providers, new housing subsidies and \$500,000 for mental health for LTS

6. Council Staff Update

CS Molnar announced that all pending Council Members have been approved by the Mayor.

7. SOA Update

- Liz Hall introduced herself and introduced her replacement, Alexandria Andrews
- Liz Hall presented the OA Voice, State off of AIDS updates including:
 - Staff Highlights

- Strategy A: Improve Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) Utilization.
- Strategy F: Improve Overall Quality of HIV-Related Care
- Strategy H: Improve Integration of HIV Services with sexually transmitted diseases (STD), Tuberculosis, Dental, and Other Services
- Strategy J: Increase Rates of Insurance/Benefits Coverage for PLWH or on PrEP
- Strategy K: Increase and Improve HIV Prevention and Support Services for People Who Use Drugs

8. Council Member Panel

- Co-Chair Shriver, CM Discepola, CM Harkin, and CM Emerson were featured on the panel.
- The Council thanked them for sharing and for their contributions.

9. California State Update- VOTE

- Courtney Mulhorn-Pearson presented updated the Council on State advocacy work including:
 - State legislative update
 - AB 362- Overdose Prevention Site
 - SB 159- Expand access to PREP and PEP
 - SB 29- HEALTH4ALL Seniors
 - SB 233- Sex Workers Rights
 - State budget update
 - \$20 million for HIV, HCV & STD Prevention
 - \$2 million to establish and End the Epidemics task for and create and integrated strategic plan to coordinate the state's response to HIV, HCV and STDs.
 - \$15.2 million for care navigators at syringe access programs
 - Statewide End the Epidemics proposal
 - U=U
 - HIV negative individuals can eliminate their risk of acquiring the virus (PrEP and PEP)
 - HCV drugs can cure the vast majority of people in as little as 8-12 weeks
 - STD Screening, rapid treatment and enhanced partner services
 - Harm reduction services- including syringe access, med assisted therapy and supervised consumption sites.
 - Recognition of the negative impact of stigma and other determinants of health
 - Governor's single-purchaser proposal
 - Aim is to consolidate all the state's drug purchases into a single stream with the goal of increasing California's negotiating power against pharmaceutical companies.
 - Potential to hugely impact the 340B program- currently hospitals and clinics negotiate directly with managed care plans.
 - Timeline still unclear- originally proposed end of 2021 but now they are convening a taskforce to full examine impact.
 - CM Lee-Miyaki inquired about data from people who are turned away from PrEP if (PrEP bill, look at slides) doesn't pass.
 - Courtney Mulhorn-Pearson didn't think it was possible and hopefully not necessary to capture that data.

10. Senior/LTS Provider Panel

- Meredith Green (Ward 86), Vince Crisotomo (SFAF), Ramon Matos (AHP) were featured on the Senior/LTS Panel.
- CS Molnar inquired about what providers can do to support the LTS community

- Vince Cristostamo suggested the providers get to know the history as continue needs assessments as well referring to completed needs assessment.
- o Provider from AHP
- Helen Lin inquired about the inaccessibility of housing as well other barriers to engagement.
 - Vince Cristostamo spoke to programs that meet client where they're at.
 - Meredith Green spoke about some senior buildings that are not fully accessible as well as integration of programs through CoE
 - Vince Cristostamo noted that long term survivors have made demands but have not seen changes.
 - AHP provider (look up)- spoke about care navigation and case management to help clients navigate the system.
- CM Lee-Miyaki inquired about lessons to be passed down from LTS to people who have lived with HIV
 or were diagnosed at a young age but have lived with HIV for many years. He also inquired about
 providers who are working at effects of long-term inflammation.
 - Meredith Green spoke about groups that let people self-identify as long-term survivors. She also recommended various providers.
 - Vince Cristostamo spoke about the various definitions depending on the community
- Co-Chair Shriver spoke to the success of the system of care and how that has created an environment
 for many people living with HIV who are aging and dealing with age-related challenges. He spoke to a
 need for more aging specialty without HIV care.
 - Ramon Matos noted that the power is where there is more funding and resources
- The council thanked the panel.
